Are there not many complicated cases for maternal and newborn health where you've had Are you comfortable asking colleagues questions? Have you ever felt reluctant to approach a colleague? Why or Why not?

If you did have a question who would you go to?

If yes:

Are you usually with a patient at the time, or is it after a visit? Is the patient aware/present when you are asking for advice?

What kind of advice are you usually asking for? Does it relate to routine maternal or newborn care or emergencies?

Who do you go to for advice? [show roster, document HCW code. If not PHCU member, ask cadre and current working location] Why do you go to them for advice? How do you know them? Do you go to anyone else for advice? [If they mention more than one person, ask about the circumstances they would go to one versus the other-- is it based on their expertise or who is available?]

Are they usually able to provide advice, why or why not? Are they able to answer your questions completely or are you left with more questions? Have you had more than one conversation about a complicated case?

What happens if that person doesn't know the answer to your questions? What other sources of information have you used [probe: reference books, websites, etc]

When and where does this advice exchange take place? Is it over the phone, e-mail or in person? Probes that could have been asked: Can you describe the process? Did the person pick up the phone straight away? If not did they call you back? Is it a brief conversation or does it usually last long? Do you pay for the cost of the call or it is covered by the woreda? If not, is cost of call a barrier to advice seeking? In person, does it occur in the health facility or somewhere else? Why?

How often do you seek advice? Can you remember the lapse of time between the most recent situations in which you asked for advice?

Are there reasons why you can't seek advice when you need to? [If advice exchanges over phone, ask: Have you ever experienced signalling issue over the phone?]

Do you feel like your needs for professional advice around maternal and newborn health are met? Why or why not? Is there an area of maternal or newborn in particular in which you need advice? If yes, which one?

Do you have any ideas for what could help you access advice more easily, when you need it?

Do you have someone you consider a mentor? Is this person an official supervisor or unofficial? Tell me about the mentorship you receive, can you describe your interactions? How much time do you spend together, where do these interactions take place? [If unofficial] Why is the mentorship unofficial?
