Study title: Feasibility of village health teams (VHTs) in using a smart phone guided intervention to link older Ugandans with chronic conditions to care

What is the purpose of this study?

The purpose of this study is to establish if members of the Village Health Teams can be trained to record information on a smart phone and use this information to link old people with chronic diseases to health facilities so that they can be treated. We also want to know the activities Village health teams are involved in and their previous experiences in working with old people. We also want to train Village Health Teams in identifying old people with chronic conditions like hypertension and diabetes. In addition, we shall give more training to health workers at health centre IV on how to treat old people with chronic conditions

Why are you being asked to join this feasibility study?

You are being asked to join the study because you are a member of the Village Health Team in Bukulula Sub-County in Kalungu District. As a member of the VHT, and as someone who stays in the villages where old people live, we hope we can work with you

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in trying to develop this new method of using a smart phone to link older people with chronic conditions to care.

Do you have to take part?

Your participation in this study is entirely voluntary and you can withdraw at any time during the study without giving a reason for your withdrawing. Your withdrawing from this study will not affect you in any way.

What will happen when I agree to take part?

If you agree to take part in this study, you will be requested to sign an informed consent form. You will also be asked to participate in an interview which will take about 45 minutes to 1 hour. This interview will be conducted at an office at Bukulula health centre IV in Kalungu district or at your home if this is convenient for you. In the interview, you will be asked open-ended questions and you will be requested to give your answers in detail. The interviewer may ask you to clarify some of your responses or to provide more light on some of your answers. The interview will consist of questions on your experiences as a VHT, what health roles you play in your villages, your experiences in dealing with older people with health problems, the process through which you were selected as a VHT and how your work as a VHT is coordinated. In addition, we shall ask you questions on your experiences in using smart phones and your willingness to use information on these phones to connect older people with chronic conditions to health facilities. The interviews will be audio recorded, if you give permission, to enable the interviewer to review in detail everything that was said in the interview without missing any point. If you prefer that a recorder is not used, only notes will be taken. You will receive 10,000/- shillings for the time you have given us.

In the second part of the study, we shall organise a 3 days non-residential training for you. In this training, we shall give you basic information on how to identify older persons with chronic diseases especially hypertension, diabetes mellitus and chronic breathing problems. We shall also train you on how to use simple movable medical instruments on how to measure blood pressure and fasting blood sugar. Meals and transport will be catered for during this training.

What are the possible risks and/or discomforts of taking part?

There is minimal risk in your taking part in this study.

Will my taking part in this study be kept confidential?

All the information you give us will be kept confidential, only accessed by the interviewers, the data managers and the Investigators. Only study numbers but not names will be used to identify the study participants. All the information you give us will

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be stored in a computer and will be viewed by only authorized people. Your name will not be used in the final report for this study.

What are the possible benefits of taking part?

In the short term, you are not going to get any benefits by participating in this study. In the long term, the results from this study will help us to develop an intervention that will eventually improve the health and wellbeing of older Ugandans with chronic conditions.

Who is organising and funding the research?

The research is organised by Dr. Joseph Mugisha Okello of MRC/UVRI Uganda Research Unit on AIDS. The other co-Investigators are Professor Janet Seeley, Head of Social Sciences Program MRC/UVRI, Uganda Research Unit and Professor Hannah Kuper of London School of Hygiene and tropical Medicine. The research is funded by a career development grant from DELTAS Africa Initiative grant no DEL-15-011 to THRiVE-2

Who has reviewed the study?

Ethical approval for this study has been obtained from the Institutional Review Board of the Uganda Virus Research Institute Research and Ethics committee and from the Uganda National Council for Science and Technology.
