Study Title: Sexual and Physical Abuse among Patients with Severe Mental Illness in Kampala and Masaka

Interview guide

In-depth interviews for patients who have experienced sexual abuse

Socio- demographics (age, sex, marital status, religion, tribe, residence, employment, level of education, social economic status, diagnosis) and rapport building

- 1. How has been your experience Living mental illness (Probe for the treatment received, adherence, suicidality, substance abuse, risky sexual behaviour)
- 2. How often have you experienced relapses? (*Probe when the relapses happened and what could have influenced them*)
- 3. Can you tell me briefly your experience about the abuse (mention the form of abuse) you experienced? (Probe *for when the abuse happened, where the abuse took place and how it happened*)
- a) Who was the perpetrator (Husband, relative, friend, stranger, etc.)?
- b) Reactions of the patient to the abuse (Probe for the following)
- How did you feel about/after the abuse? (Also probe how the patient feels now about the abuse)
- How did you react to the abuse when it happened?
- How has this abuse affected your wellbeing (*Physically, psychologically/ mentally, adherence to treatment, suicidality, HIV infection, syphilis infection, involvement in risky sexual behaviours and substance abuse, repeated sexual/physical abuse*)
- c) Did you ever think of disclosing this abuse to anybody?
 - If yes, who did you disclose the abuse to, and what motivated you to disclose the abuse? What were the outcomes for disclosure?
 - If no, what hindered you from disclosing this information
- 4. What makes people with severe mental illness vulnerable to these abuses?
- 5. Ever since you experienced this form of abuse, what are the changes/challenges you have experienced in your life? (Also probe for perceptions)
- 6. What do you think can be done to reduce abuse among patients with SMI?
- 7. Do you have any general comment to make as regards abuse of persons with severe mental illness?
