



## Data management and sharing requirements for Cancer Research UK (CRUK) funded research

<b>Resource types covered:</b>	Research outputs that are safe to share, including data and code that underpin publications, as well as unpublished data.
<b>Data Plan:</b>	A 'Data Management and Sharing Plan' must be completed & uploaded to the electronic grant management system (eGMS) as an appendix: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Population Research Committee: a structured template must be completed &amp; uploaded</li><li>• Other committees: a free-text plan should be written that addresses the key themes</li></ul>
<b>Data-related funds:</b>	Data-related fees may be requested, on condition that the purpose of the expenditure is explained in the application.
<b>Retention:</b>	CRUK states outputs must be kept for at least 5 years after grant closure. The LSHTM Retention Schedule, which requires research outputs be retained for a minimum of 10 years, will take precedent.
<b>Data standards:</b>	Open, well-documented standards and formats appropriate to the subject.
<b>Documentation:</b>	Subject-specific documentation should be produced that describes the content and context in which it was created.
<b>Hosting arrangements:</b>	Deposit with an appropriate subject specific repository is encouraged. If one does not exist, a generic or institutional repository is appropriate – see subject-specific guides below.
<b>Sharing timescales:</b>	No later than acceptance for publication of the main findings from the final dataset, or on a timescale in line with the procedures of the relevant domain (unless 3rd party agreements or IP protection apply).
<b>Rights:</b>	IPR will remain with the institution(s) performing the research. However, CRUK require that they are granted a non-exclusive licence to use data for non-commercial research.
<b>Monitoring:</b>	Data management and sharing activities should be reported in progress reports and the final report.
