LSHTM support for Data Management Planning



A Data Management Plan is a document that describes how research data will be handled during a project and following its completion. LSHTM researchers should prepare a Data Management Plan for their project at the earliest opportunity.

LSHTM expectations for data management planning

Public or private funded projects that are capturing or creating data <u>must</u> prepare a Data Management Plan to ensure adequate steps are taken to manage research files. Consultancy work, unfunded research and projects without a data component are exempt from LSHTM's DMP requirement.

If your research funder does not provide a DMP template, the LSHTM template at https://doi.org/10.17037/PUBS.03716765 may be used. Clinical trials should consult the LSHTM Data Management Plan template in appendix 1 of the Data Management for Clinical Trials SOP (LSHTM SOP 037).

MPhil/PhD/DrPH students should prepare a Data Management Plan using the template at https://doi.org/10.17037/PUBS.03750331 and include it in their Upgrading or Review report as an appendix.

MSc Students performing research in pursuit of a qualification are not required to write a DMP. However, data management issues must be considered when planning research.
