

Preparing a Data Management Plan for research funding

A Data Management Plan (DMP) is a written document that outlines how research assets will be acquired, managed and shared during a research study and following its completion.

Expectations

LSHTM-led research projects working with research data should prepare a Data Management Plan (DMP) before commencement of research, even if not required by their research funder. Further information is available in the [LSHTM Research Data Management Policy](#).

Many research funders require a data management plan to be submitted as part of a research bid. This includes UKRI funders (ESRC, MRC, EPSRC), Wellcome Trust and Gates Foundation. Other funders, such as the European Commission, indicate a full DMP must be produced as a deliverable within 6 months.

DMPOnline

The DMPOnline (<https://dmponline.dcc.ac.uk/>) platform offers DMP templates for all major UK and EU funding bodies, with supplementary guidance written by the research community.
